New logo for Foundation

The Lac du Bonnet and District Charitable Foundation has a new logo.

Created by local graphic artist Sheldon Sveinson, the logo was designed to represent a brick, symbolizing strength and endurance.

"The former logo served us well. It contained a lot of symbolism but not everyone got it," said John Barnard, VP Fund Development. "We wanted a logo that represented something solid, like the Foundation."

Foundation board member Gerry Arbez said that the brick in the new logo was designed after those that were manufactured at the Lac du Bonnet Brick Company, complete with the imprint that was imbedded to represent where it was manufactured. These bricks built many of the historic buildings that still stand in the community.

"This community was built with LDB bricks, and the Foundation is continuing to build the community," said Arbez. "It's simple, memorable and readily identifies the Foundation: one piece, one grant, one donation at a time."

Arbez said that he hopes that the community will embrace the new logo and that through its simplicity it will become "affectionately known as the LDB Foundation."

The Lac du Bonnet Foundation was established in 2008, and in only eight years the fund has grown quickly to a current balance of \$400,000.

"We maxed out with matching grants from both the Thomas Sill and Endow Manitoba Giving challenges last year due to the generosity of the community," said Barnard.

The Foundation accepts grant requests from nonprofit groups in the area all year, and reviews and approves proposals in April and in November. Barnard noted that the April grant recipients will be announced in the near future.

The Lac du Bonnet and District Charitable Foundation will be hosting their annual general meeting on May 25 at the Pioneer Club. The board extends an invitation to everyone to come out and join them for the evening. For more information, please visit lacdubonnetfoundation.ca

Library volunteers enjoy tea time


