Tessa knew Hardin could be cruel, but when a bombshell revelation is dropped about the origins of their relationship - and Hardin's mysterious past – Tessa is beside herself in After We Collided (No. 2 After) by Anna Todd.

Gabriel Allon, art restorer and occasional spy, searches for a stolen masterpiece by Caravaggio. Sometimes the best way to find a stolen masterpiece is to steal another one, in *The Heist* by Daniel Silva; and Gilly MacMillan gives us *Odd Child Out*, a domestic suspense about the secrets families tell one another in what appears to be a prank carried too far.
